### The Birth of Ogata-mura

Lake Hachirogata was once Japan's 2<sup>nd</sup> largest lake after Lake Biwa. In 1954 (Showa 29), two Dutchmen by the names of Professor Jansen and Forker, an engineer came to Japan. Their findings resulted in the World Bank and the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations recommending the reclamation of the lagoon. After 20 years and a cost of 85.2 billion yen this massive project was completed in March 1977 (Showa 52). The bottom of Lake Hachirogata was transformed into 17,229 hectares of newborn land.

Ogata-mura became an administrative area on October 1st 1964 (Showa 39). At that time there were only 6 families and 14 people in the village. People from across Japan were rigidly selected to become its settlers. As of April 1st 2016, the population of Ogata-mura was 3169.

A 52-kilometer embankment surrounds the village. The area is so vast that Tokyo's Yamanote line would fit right inside.



The illustration above clearly shows that Ogata-mura sits below sea level.

### The 1st Japan Geopark in Tohoku Oga Peninsula and Ogata Geopark



In September 2011, Ogata-mura and Oga City were approved as a joint member of the Japan Geopark Network. The geological and natural environment of this area combined with mankind's involvement with it provides a rich learning experience.

#### A Ogata-mura and Land Reclamation

Lake Hachirogata was the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest lake in Japan. The reclamation project was started by the Japanese government in 1957 and took 20 years to complete. The lake bed which sat below sea level was transformed into newborn land by reclamation and named Ogata-mura.



#### Polder Museum of Ogata-mura

The museum provides information about the land reclamation project, the history of Ogata-mura, local agriculture and the environment. A range of visual displays, diorama and a large multi-screen graphically

#### Q What is a Geopark?

A The Geo in Geopark refers to the Earth or Mother Nature. A Geopark is a special scientific area with outstanding natural, geological, ecological or manmade features. The places where these features can be seen are referred to as Geosites.



This monument commemorates the site where the formal reclamation ceremony took place in 1964. There is another monument depicting the water level before and after the reclamation. One is able to appreciate the hard efforts of those involved in the creation of Ogata-mura.



#### Latitude and Longitude Intersection Monument

A monument stands at the point of 40° North and 140° East. There is a tower erected to signal the exact position. Ogata-mura is the only place where latitude and longitude points on the 10th degree meet in Japan. (P11)



#### Ogata Fuji

This man-made mound is Japan's lowest mountain. At a height of 3.776 meters tall, it is 1/1000th the size of Mount Fuji. Its peak rises to sea level.



#### Lake Hachirogata Water-level **Commemorative Monument**

At the same height of Ogata Fuji nearby, this monument commemorates the water level of Lake Hachirogata before reclamation. On the monument it says that one should never forget the fact that Ogata-mura sits below sea level.



#### South Pumping Station

There are 3 pumping stations to manage the volume and flow of water circulating around Ogata-mura. The South Pumping Station takes out water from the central channel into the regulating pond and controls the water level west of Ogata-mura. You can see a wide expanse of reclaimed land and canals from here.



#### **(c)** Hachirogata Tidal Gate

Lake Hachirogata was a brackish lake - a mixture of fresh water and sea water. Upon completion of the reclamation, a barrier was built to separate Hachirogata regulating pond from the sea. The remaining lake area is now fresh water. A 370meter long tidal gate not only stops seawater but also controls water volume around Ogata-mura and keeps the regulating pond at a constant level.



The decomposed matter from this vegetation dissolved into the trapped sea water to create the Moor onsen hot spring we have today.

## Try our Moor hot spring – a rare experience even in Japan!

The use of the word 'Moor' in Moor onsen (hot spring) comes from the word for 'plant matter' in German and refers to the high content of decomposed vegetation found in the water. There are many hot springs in Japan but the Moor variety is very rare indeed.

These waters effectively penetrate deep under the skin layer and warm the body with ease. It is also known for its beauty qualities because it acts as a natural cosmetic that soothes and moisturizes the skin.




